

ASPECTS OF NORTH FITZROY HISTORY

It is the intention of the committee during 2017 to undertake a project to research, record, share and publish some more of the history of North Fitzroy. It is anticipated that the outcome will be a seminar and a publication similar to that done for south Fitzroy with *Brunswick Street Lost and Found* * in 2012. Some relevant topics have or are being researched by FHS members, but not published. These include:

histories of individual houses and particular streets;

William Thomas, Guardian of the Aborigines, 1839-67, who lived at Merriville Lodge in Nth Fitzroy;

the World War I memorials;

the Bowling Club;

the Inner Circle railway.

If you have a particular interest that you would like to pursue the committee would welcome your involvement. Other topics worthy of research include:

St Georges Rd and the earlier Yan Yean tramway of 1855;

the hotels of North Fitzroy such the Aberdeen, Railway, Terminus, Tramway, etc.;

the Churches of North Fitzroy:

the Edinburgh Gardens and the early sporting clubs;

factories in North Fitzroy;

The Old Colonists Homes (Rushall Park);

demographic changes in the suburb.

We welcome additional suggestions, and any offers to be involved in the project.
