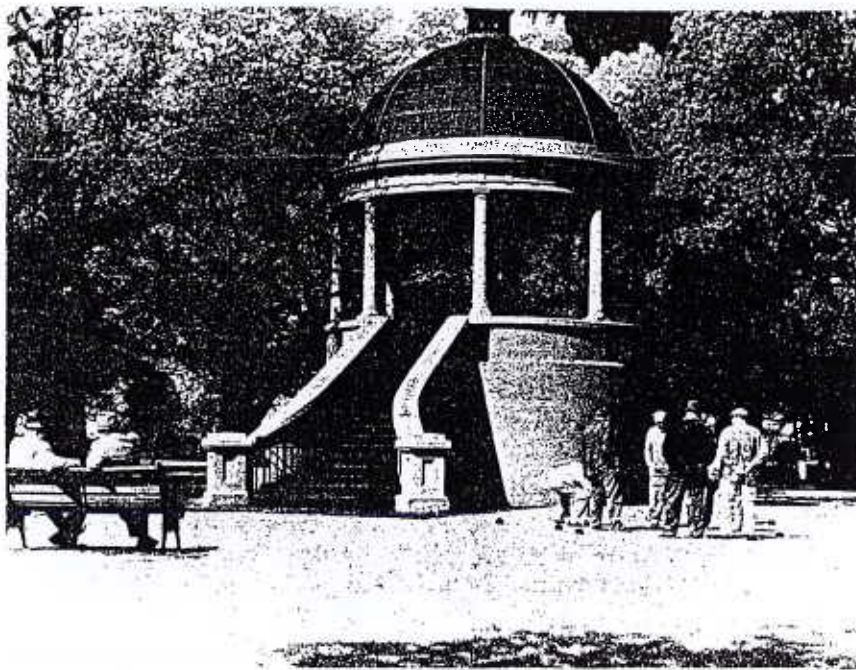




THE VICTORIAN HERITAGE FESTIVAL
