


HISTORY WALK

Fitzroy - Places of Significance

The Belvidere Hotel (now known as the Eastern Hill Hotel) on the corner of Brunswick Street and Victoria Parade, photographed c.1863 by Charles Nettleton. It was from here that the stonemasons resolved to fight for the eighthour-day. One of the strongest advocates of the movement was Dr Thomas Embling, a resident of Gore Street and the local MLA, who is credited with the slogan, Eight hours' labour, eight hours' recreation, eight hours' rest'.
