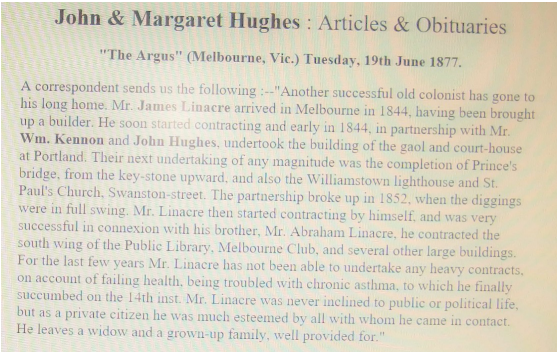
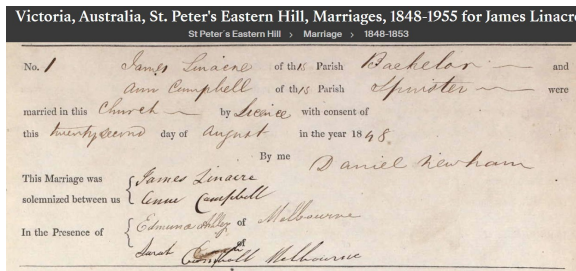


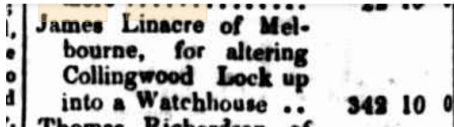
Linacre - 101 Greeves St - pre 1860



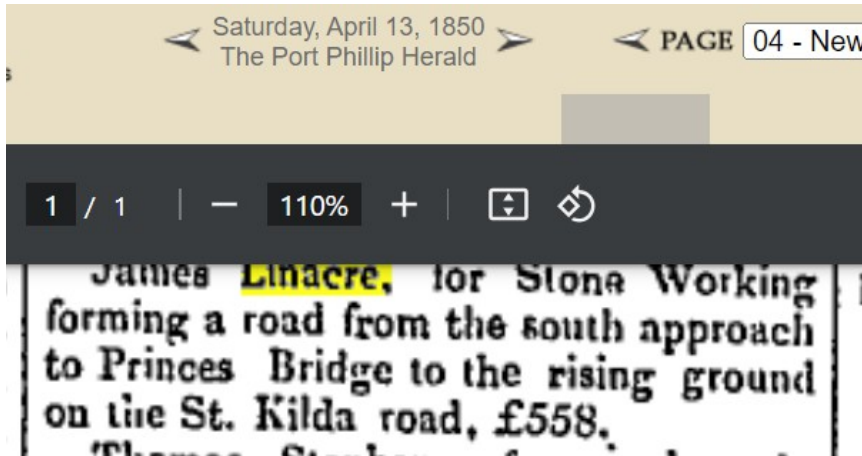
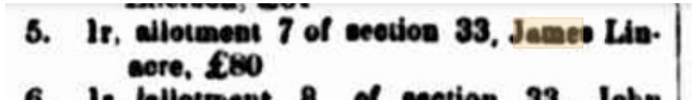
In 1848, tenders were called for a new lighthouse on Gellibrand's Point - this is the bluestone section of the tower that remains today.

The successful tenderer was James Linacre who built the bluestone lighthouse in 1849 at a cost of £825. With the tower there was also accompanying timber keepers' quarters. It commenced operations in 1849.
